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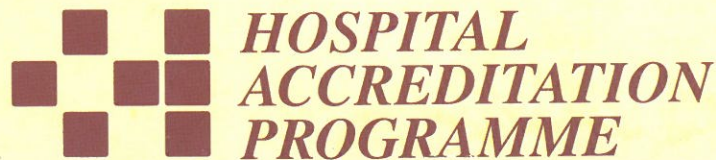
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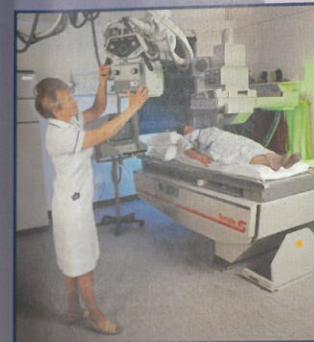
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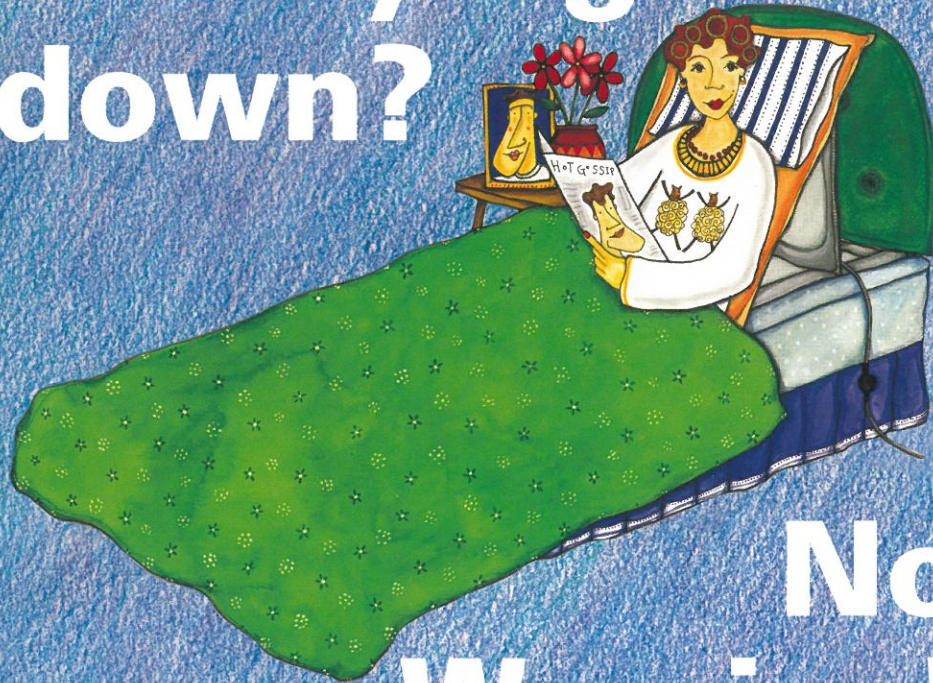

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DEFINITION OF A COMMUNITY HOSPITAL

The Community Hospitals Association has chosen to adopt the following 'working definition' of a Community Hospital, whilst recognising the variations and diversification of local hospitals throughout the UK, as local health services are designed to meet local health needs.

A local hospital, unit or centre providing an appropriate range and format of accessible health care facilities and resources. These will include inpatient and may include outpatient, diagnostic, day care, primary care and outreach services for patients provided by multidisciplinary teams. Medical care is normally led by general practitioners in liaison with consultant, nursing and paramedical colleagues, as necessary. Consultant long stay beds, primary care nurse-led and midwife services may also be incorporated.

The hospitals included in this directory vary in size, facilities and in the services that are provided in them. Each hospital, although a number do not have GP beds, fits within the definition of a Community Hospital.

We have included some Independent Community Hospitals. Their entry is identified as Independent. These are Hospitals run by Trusts or Charities offering NHS care to the local population.

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LAUNCH OF THE 1999 DIRECTORY OF COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

In 1985 the Association of General Practitioner Community Hospitals published a Handbook and Directory of Community Hospitals. Some of these directories may still be in circulation. The Directory proved invaluable as a resource file on Community Hospitals in the United Kingdom. So many changes have taken place since 1985, even the name of the Association has changed! There was a need for an updated version of the directory, in order to provide valuable information on Community Hospitals.

In 1997 the Association applied for a Section 64 Grant from the Department of Health, to provide funding to establish a database of all Community Hospitals in the United Kingdom. We were successful in our application and were awarded a small grant to enable us to develop a database.

It has taken over two years to complete the database and to reach the launch of the 1999 Directory. This has only been achieved through dogged determination. An explanation of the process of information gathering will help to demonstrate the goals the Association is trying to achieve.

Each Community Hospital that appeared in the previous directory was sent a directory update form for completion (excluding Scotland). We had a reasonable response at the first trawl. Several forms were returned with a hand written note - 'hospital closed' or now a 'psychiatric hospital,' or a 'nursing home.' A number of hospitals never replied. Those hospitals with a nil response were sent another form. If no form was returned another form was sent and so on. Over a year ago hospitals that had not returned their forms were contacted by telephone by a member of the committee in an attempt to add a more personalised touch. There was some success. However, we still had several hospitals that had not responded. Last year each hospital was sent a copy of the information that is held on the database and was asked to return this form with any amendments. We had several hospitals that had still not provided any information. In the weeks leading up to the publication of the directory each hospital that had a nil return has been contacted by telephone, and at last we have 100% response. We have acquired the information that we need for the database and to complete the directory of Community Hospitals.

The directory contains a summary of the detailed information that is held on the database, as we have been selective with the details published in the directory. It is the culmination of two years of really hard work in trying to track down all Community Hospitals in the United Kingdom.

Despite our best efforts there may be Community Hospitals that are missing. If this is the case please contact the Community Hospitals Association and provide the necessary information for the database to be updated.

Thank you to all of the staff in community hospitals who have taken time and trouble to provide us with information and have worked with us to help make this directory the most up to date and accurate record of Community Hospitals in the UK.

USE OF THE DIRECTORY

The data provided are the most up-to-date we have been able to obtain. The handbook is divided into four sections, England, Wales, Northern Ireland and Scotland.

A separate list of hospitals/sites with maternity beds and maternity led beds has been included in the directory.

Listing is in alphabetical list of place names followed by the County.

The following is the information that was requested for each directory entry:-

First line:

Town and County

Second line:

Name and postal address of the hospital.

Third line:

Telephone and fax number (where applicable)
Population (catchment population given if readily available)
Distance from the nearest District General Hospital.

Fourth line:

- a) Number of GP beds
- d) Number of consultant beds
- e) Number of GPs who work in some capacity at the hospital
- f) Number of GP practices
- g) Number of visiting consultants (figure can include outpatient clinics)

Fifth line:

- a) Casualty or Minor Injuries Unit
- b) Surgery (if minor surgery only this has not been included in the listing)
- c) Outpatient clinics
- d) Therapies
- e) Diagnostic services - X-ray plain, contrast, ultrasound
- f) Day Services

As we go to press considerable efforts have been made to ensure that the information is accurate. However, it has proved impossible to obtain certain information. Inevitably there will be changes to the information provided in this directory. A directory update form has been included and the future accuracy of the publication depends on these being returned, completed accurately.

FOREWORD

COMMUNITY HOSPITALS ASSOCIATION DIRECTORY

Introduction

As an Association we are proud to be issuing our new directory of Community Hospitals. The directory lists 471 community hospitals throughout the UK, with 322 in England, 85 in Scotland, 58 in Wales, 4 in Northern Ireland, 1 in Guernsey and 1 in the Isle of Man. The directory includes NHS Community Hospitals as well as those managed independently.

The Community Hospitals Association is committed to raising the profile of Community Hospitals and drawing attention to the role that they can play in meeting the health care needs of local populations. In our work with the hospitals we continue to be impressed with the imagination, flexibility and innovation shown in the planning and management of services in finding local solutions to meet local needs.

Policy Context

We are fortunate that the current Government policy supports extending primary care and developing health services close to people's homes. The enthusiasm for intermediate care schemes sits well with the model of service that a number of community hospitals have been providing for some time.

The attention given to developing integrated services is also in keeping with the way that small hospitals work within their communities. There are many examples of integrated work across professions, disciplines and agencies. The evidence of team work between the various professions within the hospital is shown for instance in the area of rehabilitation. The benefits of working across agencies such as with social services is demonstrated in planning and managing care for older people. Integration with other providers of services can be seen in services such as palliative care, where specialist nurses (Macmillan nurses) the community hospital staff, the local hospice and voluntary agencies work together for the benefit of the patient. Of course the hospital services are embedded in the community, through the tireless work of Leagues of Friends and other support networks.

Services

The range of services and facilities offered in Community Hospitals is increasing all the time. For instance, diagnostic services are developing to include ultrasound and dexta scanners as well as X-ray. Many are extending the range and frequency of clinics held locally, with benefits to the patient and the visiting specialist staff.

Day services for older people including those with mental health needs are often run with social services and help to sustain patients within their own homes and within the community. Day services are also offered in many places to adults with disabilities and chronic ill health and also to patients who require palliative care.

One of the services most highly valued is the casualty/minor injury service. The availability of an emergency service for minor injuries is considered to be a key role for the hospital. It certainly saves patients travelling to central Accident and Emergency Centres that can often be very busy. Many minor injuries departments are run by Nurse Practitioners and there are a number of initiatives around this service including telephone support systems and integration with GP out-of-hours co-operatives.

The Community Hospital wards continue to cater for a wide range of patients, including those requiring acute medical care, assessment, rehabilitation, palliative & terminal care, post-operative care and respite care. The holistic approach to in-patient care is provided through the

support of the primary health care team and the Community Hospital staff. This model gives the patient continuity of care in a local setting.

Community Hospitals throughout the UK provide an extensive range of services in addition to those referred to above. These may include maternity, surgery, mental health services and community clinics. These services have been developed and sustained through the support of the GPs, the staff and their communities.

One of the features of the Community Hospital model is how well these services and facilities work together in an integrated way to provide a continuum of care.

Facilities

Community Hospitals are increasingly providing a focus for education and research, with excellent examples of collaborative ventures and partnerships with colleges and universities. Formalising the role of these hospitals in education, training and development is helping in the recognition of the hospitals as dynamic learning centres.

Facilities offered to patients, carers, visitors and the general public are extensive in some areas. These may include a community restaurant, meals on wheels, laundry, creche, fitness centre, meeting rooms, shop, citizens advice bureau, pharmacy, dentist, library and community transport,

Developments

The Association has welcomed the opening of new Community Hospitals and newly developed departments of hospitals. We are pleased to provide support and advice to those who are facing the challenge of developing urban Community Hospitals

We are delighted to see that the hospitals that are now owned and managed by their local communities are thriving. We continue to be impressed by the resourcefulness of local communities who are totally committed to safeguarding their services. We are sorry to have seen the closure of several Community Hospitals and continue to support those communities in ensuring that they receive community-based services in other ways in the future. Many Community Hospitals have been subject to in depth reviews in the context of local strategies and national policies.

The Association acts as a resource to its membership and to all associated hospitals, services and organisations. We work closely with the Department of Health on policy and research and are grateful to them for the funding for the preparation of our database and this document.

The Future

As an Association we are optimistic about the future of Community Hospitals and community services. Imaginative developments, strong partnerships and vigorous community support are all features of the Community Hospital of the future. These hospitals can make a real contribution to the health and well being of local people. The hospitals enable District General Hospitals to focus on patients who require specialist secondary care and ease the pressure on their beds, clinics and emergency services.

The Association continues to work for the benefit of its members and all Community Hospitals. We hold regular conferences, seminars, publish newsletters, support research and offer advice. We hope that through this directory and the work of the Association, we can play a part in promoting Community Hospitals and securing a strong future for this valued element of our health care system.

HISTORY

With its thirtieth anniversary due in December 1999 the Community Hospitals Association is now well established. The spark, which fired its founding, came from Bishopsteignton in Devon where Dr Michael Tuck, a local GP, had become frustrated by fruitless attempts to obtain reasonable remuneration for casualty work. Following a letter to the BMJ he arranged a meeting in Exeter and the Association of General Practitioner Hospitals was created. This clumsy title was chosen to avoid using the term 'cottage', which can have Victorian connotations. The introduction of 'Community' was discussed but considered to be too abstruse.

Rather than simply pursue remuneration, the aim of the Association was stated as the retention and development of GP Hospitals as an integral part of the NHS. The majority of these units were very much under the threat of closure foretold by the hospital plan of 1962 which pressed for the concentration of resources into hospitals of 300 beds or more.

Of the 2800 hospitals in England and Wales over 1000 were listed for closure, but many of these were small specialist units whose absorption into the main body of the District General Hospital was a rational and generally desirable move. The closure of local hospitals staffed by GPs, however, was an entirely different matter.

The Association began as a pressure group, and soon set about gathering information upon which its arguments were to be sustained. The Chairman (and his successors) toured the country visiting GP hospitals. Two essential features soon became apparent - that as a group they should be looked upon as an extension of General Practice and that in particular each was unique. No two hospitals were alike in size or function.

In 1974 the Oxford Regional Hospital Board, realising the impossibility of catering for a largely rural population with District General Hospitals alone, came up with proposals for the establishment of Community Hospitals, using the newly-designed unit at Wallingford as its model.

Meantime the number of closures had remained small and the Cottage/Community Hospitals of Britain were gathering strength and enthusiasm. Despite common belief there are still, in Great Britain over 450 Community Hospitals and for every closure in recent years there has been a new hospital opened.

In 1977 the classic study made by the Association's second Chairman, Dr Sandy Cavenagh of Brecon, revealed that over half the patients treated in General Hospital beds could be cared for equally well or better in a small hospital near their homes.

The gathering of accurate information has been bugged by problems of definition, made more difficult recently by the trend for small specialist units to adopt the term 'Community'.

At last, after years of gestation, the CHA has come up with this, the second Directory. Its pages reveal the wide range of activities encompassed by today's Community Hospitals that have a unique ability to adapt to local demands and conditions.

MANAGEMENT OF COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

Community Hospitals remain an important resource in the NHS. At present they may be part of an Acute Trust and seen as an adjunct to a District General Hospital, or part of a Community Trust as an extension of primary health care. In the near future Primary Care Trusts will be able to run Community Hospitals and other community services. "By integrating primary and community healthcare, Primary Care Trusts will provide a focus for rehabilitation and recovery services. Patients will be able to use local Community Hospitals to the full rather than having to travel to more distant acute hospitals" (1).

In the past there have been hospital managers who may have had one of many titles such as Service Manager, Matron, Senior Sister, Care Co-ordinator, Locality Manager or Practice Manager. This manager may also have had responsibility for managing other services such as community or primary health care but was also clearly identified as the manager responsible for the hospital.

Community Hospitals in many cases are seen as an integral part of the local community or as a focal point for healthcare services and the hospital manager is often responsible for fostering relationships within the locality. This model is ideally suited to the new Government papers on a primary health care led NHS.

Throughout all the past and present changes which impact on Community Hospitals some important principles remain and one of these is the need for clearly identified leadership. The management arrangements for the Community Hospital should have clear lines of accountability for all departments, specialities and services through the manager to the parent organisation.

The Government has stated that they wish to see a "National Health Service which offers dependable high standards of care and treatment everywhere. The three continuing objectives are to improve continually the overall standards of clinical care, to reduce unacceptable variations in clinical practice and to ensure the best use of resources so that patients receive the greatest benefits. The care provided should be appropriate to people's needs, effective by drawing on available clinical evidence and efficient and economic to maximise health gain." (2).

THE NURSES ROLE WITHIN THE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL SETTING

Since the early writings about the arrival of the Community Hospital in the 1860's there have been many long political battles to ensure their survival. These battles are now being rewarded with the promise of not only survival, but revival (3), as the White Paper recognises the value of Community Hospitals in providing primary and intermediate care for local populations.

Nursing also has had to fight many long, hard battles in its quest for acceptance of professional status. The past five years has seen a tremendous growth in nursing knowledge and practice development, with the boundaries of traditional nursing being expanded to the needs of clients as they exert their rights to expert health care. The recent White Paper places greater emphasis on integration of community services to meet the health care needs of the local community and nurses have a major role to this end.

The role of the nurse requires expert clinical practice with responsibility for assessing, planning, implementing and evaluating nursing care in order that people are assisted in coping with health problems. The UKCC recognises three levels of nursing practice: professional practitioner, specialist practitioner and advanced nursing practitioner. The professional practitioner functioning at a generic skill level and the specialist nurse having education and skill to a higher level. Often within the Community Hospital this specialism is within the field of rehabilitation.

The advanced nursing practitioner takes on a leadership role expanding the boundaries of traditional nursing practice, acting as a role model and facilitator of nurses. At each level there are attempts made to integrate clinical practice, education and research in order to provide the most appropriate and effective care for patients/clients. This cannot be done in isolation and is achieved within a multidisciplinary team, with the nurse playing an important role in enabling this collaboration.

Due to the nature of the Community Hospital, medical care is often supported by local General Practitioners, who also have demands from their busy practice life. Having no "instant doctor" places a greater degree of responsibility on nurses to recognise and report medical issues appropriately and promptly to ensure patients receive the care they require (2). This has led to the need to increase nurses' assessment skills and expand their traditional role.

The UKCC "Code of Professional Conduct" (5), set a baseline for nursing practice, this being followed by the "Scope of Professional Practice" (6), giving freedom to nurses to expand their role by taking on new skills and assisting in setting up new services to meet client need.

With this greater responsibility and accountability comes the need for education at a higher level and clinical supervision to support, develop and maintain professional standards of practice. (1).

Nurses are also charged to act as the patient's advocate regarding health care needs. Having 24 hour responsibility for patients, they are in a position to see the "grass root" needs of the community which they serve and should be allowed a voice in planning health care strategies.

Thanks to the White Paper, the Community Hospital should play a vital role in the 21st century in the provision of intermediate care, allowing a much more integrated and accessible service for their local population. Although nursing has travelled a long way in its quest for true professional status, there are more new and exciting challenges on the horizon. The key to this advancement lies within the empowerment of nurses to develop professionally in order to contribute to what is every patients/clients right, "quality care".

GP REMUNERATION

As an independent practitioner, the GPs main source of income is through the practice for the primary care service provided. GPs working in Community Hospitals are paid through a series of different systems.

Remuneration for working in casualty is calculated on a clinical session basis according to a national formula, and is sensitive to the level of activity within the department. Therefore the number of sessions increases with the number of casualties seen.

Remuneration for in-patient care for Consultant beds is on a clinical assistant session, usually calculated on a time-equivalent basis. The Consultant retains the overall responsibility for the beds.

Remuneration for GP beds has been subject to local negotiation, as the national formula and level of pay has been considered to be inadequate. The national "bed fund" system is an allocation on the number of occupied beds, shared between the GPs on contract to provide medical cover to these beds. Systems replacing the bed fund include a payment for the number of episodes, a payment for the number of occupied bed days and a sophisticated points system. The points system was developed by the GMSC as a guide to GPs. There is no consistent system or level of remuneration for GPs to provide the medical cover to GP beds resulting in a wide variation in the agreements made.

As GPs take on more clinical responsibility through extended primary care and local innovations, they are assessing the implications to their practice in terms of workload and income. GPs are taking on more of a commissioning and management role through the PCGs and this is placing an additional pressure on the remuneration system, GPs are requiring NHS Trusts to re-consider the current pay systems and offer them a realistic remuneration package. In return GPs are required to fulfil requirements for clinical recording and audit and work to new systems of accountability.

Each Trust and GP practice is having to carefully assess the balance between making the remuneration fair and making it affordable within the context of the future of the hospital. In many areas this has been negotiated successfully and the Association holds information on models of good practice in this regard.

MEDICAL EDUCATION IN COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

The presence of undergraduate medical students in primary care is becoming increasingly common, related to the reduction in acute medical beds in the NHS and the development of a primary care led NHS. Medical schools are expanding medical student attachments in the community and evidence is accumulating that medical students acquire knowledge and skills equally well if not better when taught in a primary care setting compared with the traditional teaching hospital setting (1).

With increasing specialisation of medicine in District General Hospitals (DGH), primary care and community hospital care are areas where medical students can experience general medicine and see an interface between general practice and inpatient care not experienced in the DGH. Many students have enjoyed Community Hospital/general practice attachments, but until recently the attachments had not been formalised or evaluated.

The Tayside Centre for General Practice at the University of Dundee has organised a three-month general practice/Community Hospital attachment for undergraduate medical students. The attachment aims to cover experience of clerking and follow up of Community Hospital patients, attendance at Community Hospital outpatient clinics, theatre lists and minor injury units. There is an emphasis on team working and spending time with different members of the Community Hospital and primary health care teams. Terminal care cases and acute cases admitted to a DGH and discharged to a Community Hospital are followed and written up. A project relevant to an aspect of their experience is part of the attachment. The experience of a cohort of students who have been through such an attachment has been evaluated and published (2).

An important part of the assessment is the preparation of a portfolio of experience gained which gives valuable insight into the wide variety offered by such an attachment. Funding for this method of teaching had been agreed with the relevant medical school and serves as an example of how other schemes might develop with the emphasis being on "money following the student".

With the reorganisation of primary care and formation of Primary Care Groups there will be opportunities to increase the level of medical student teaching in Community Hospitals with the exercise itself being an impetus to improving standards in Community Hospitals.

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INPATIENTS IN COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

Placed as they are, between primary and secondary care, Community Hospitals can provide the ideal facilities for the development of services in a modern health service.

The old cottage hospitals tried to provide a near comprehensive service for their local residents. As the District General Hospital's (DGH) developed, it was realised that a better quality of service could often be provided in centres with higher volumes of activity. Consequently, services were withdrawn from the local hospitals, often leading to their closure. Over recent years, patterns of treatment have begun to change once again. DGH's are becoming increasing expensive, and pressures to reduce length of stay have become irresistible. Considerations of "appropriateness" and quality of care have led to the conclusions that considerable numbers of patients occupying hospital beds are not actually benefiting from being in a DGH. They could be managed more effectively in cheaper beds, nearer to their homes.

Increasingly, patients are being discharged to Community Hospitals in the early days following major surgery and medical cases being transferred for rehabilitation, once their investigations have been completed. Similarly, it is recognised that many of the patients who are currently admitted inappropriately to DGH's would be appropriate admissions to the less costly facility of a Community Hospital. Many of the cases which contribute to the "winter pressures" for DGH admissions are likely to fall into this category. Modern techniques of telemedicine enable staff in the peripheral hospitals to keep in touch with centres of excellence and thus avoid the risk of professional isolation.

The principle of appropriateness applies across all levels of the Community Hospital activity. Modern communications allow a pattern of care in which patients can move between their home, Community Hospital, DGH and regional hospitals, as their condition requires.

CARE FOR OLDER PEOPLE

The increasing number of older people, particularly those who are frail or who have mental health needs, requires a service which is sensitive to their needs and preferences. Evidence shows that older people are less likely to be disorientated if cared for at home or close to home, particularly by staff that they are already familiar with. The benefit of continuity of care is well documented. The integrated packages of health and social care, covering day care, in-patient care and home support all provided through the Community Hospital, can be invaluable. The role of the Community Hospital in relation to the recent Royal Commission report "With Respect to Old Age" is likely to increase, as older people can be supported locally with their nursing care and rehabilitation needs. The Community Hospital can act as a focus for health, social care and housing needs to be assessed, planned and managed.

REHABILITATION

One of the key roles of the Community Hospital is rehabilitation. The rehabilitation teams include the physiotherapist, occupational therapist, chiropodist, speech and language therapist and psychologist as well as the doctors, nurses and social workers involved in an individuals care. The range of in-patient and ambulatory services enables the hospital to support people flexibly and create a rehabilitation programme appropriate for individual circumstances. Typical episodes include patients who are recovering from CVA, and those who have had a joint replacement and need to re-mobilise.

Shared care arrangements, with clinical staff working to agreed protocols and care pathways, can enable the respective Community Hospitals and the DGH resources to be used to best effect. Each hospital has a defined role and the interface between the two distinct models of service can be made explicit. By working in collaboration to agreed protocols and care pathways each sector of the service can play its part.

In keeping with all clinical practice within the Community Hospital the service is subject to clinical effectiveness studies through evidence-based standard setting and clinical audit. The services interface at the primary care, community care and secondary care levels and provide an excellent example of integrated working to the benefit of the patient.

PALLIATIVE CARE IN COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

Palliative care has been a traditionally accepted role of Community Hospitals with some of the advantages being care near to the patient's home, nursing staff known to the patient, low technology surroundings and personal care by the patient's own general practitioner (GP). One study demonstrated that where GPs had access to Community Hospital beds there was a significant decrease in cancer deaths in the District General Hospital (DGH) compared with GPs without access to community hospital beds (1). With the rapid expansion of the hospice movement and specialist palliative care the standard for Community Hospitals to reach has shifted from the DGH to the local hospice service.

Further research has recently been published (2) (3) which looks at the quality of medical and nursing care in terminal cancer care in Community Hospitals compared with an inpatient hospice service. These studies confirmed the important contribution of Community Hospitals to palliative terminal care and illustrated that drug prescribing and interventions performed by Community Hospital doctors were broadly similar to prescribing and interventions performed by hospice doctors. A negative feature was the poor quality of Community Hospital medical records (but not nursing records) which could represent under-recording of patient's symptoms and is an area that needs attention.

Carers of those patients dying in either Community Hospital or hospice settings were interviewed around three months after the death. These interviews confirmed the high quality service provided by the hospice, against which the Community Hospitals performed well, despite being non-specialist units with less than half the number of trained nursing staff. Problems in Community Hospital care were poor communication, lack of nursing staff and lack of support in bereavement. Improvements in terms of communication skills of doctors and nurses, specific training for nurses in palliative care and structured bereavement care could be made without necessarily increasing staffing numbers.

Overall Community Hospitals provide a much needed hospice role in rural areas where hospice provision is often minimal. The standards of care are acceptable and follow sound principles of palliative care, but improvements are always possible and need to be ongoing. A close liaison between Community Hospital medical and nursing staff with local specialist palliative care services is essential to maintain standards and enable expert opinion to be readily available for Community Hospital patients.

SURGERY IN COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

Many Community Hospitals provide a well-established, safe, cost effective service for planned, routine surgical admissions. They are well supported by visiting specialists and the local community. They attract and retain high quality nursing and medical staff. The complementary nature of Community Hospitals and District General Hospitals cannot be over emphasised. Co-operation between General Practitioners and Consultants in Community Hospitals is one of the happiest features of the National Health Service.

Current evidence suggests that there are no real reasons to doubt that clinical outcomes in small hospitals can be as good as those in larger units, if patient selection is carefully monitored and reasonable throughput maintained. Many studies report increased patient satisfaction with their care generally than in larger units.

Some areas (especially rural) Community Hospitals make a vital contribution to the total volume of surgery performed within the district. Case selection is the most important single determinant of the outcome of surgical services. The organisation and availability of facilities, equipment and staff should be appropriate for the scope of services provided. Local surgical expertise should ideally be available to manage patients in the absence of the visiting specialist.

Despite the increased feasibility of day surgery, new technological advances and recent national recognition of the great benefits to patients of decentralised services, surgery in some Community Hospitals has reduced or remains under threat. However, pockets of excellence do exist, and thrive. The three key requirements being: -

- * patient selection
- * appropriateness of the service and
- * active GP support

ANAESTHETICS IN COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

Anaesthesia has developed rapidly as a specialty over the past couple of decades, so that the modern anaesthetist has to be the master of many techniques. In the 1960's and 70's a six month house job in the Anaesthetic Department enabled the budding GP to take the Diploma of Anaesthesia if he/she wished to add an extra dimension to medical practice in a Community Hospital. With this qualification many GPs kept the operating theatres functioning, and many patients had surgery carried out safely in the familiar surroundings of their local hospital.

The scene has changed dramatically, and the Royal College of Anaesthetists has declared that anaesthesia in isolated units is not to be undertaken unless stringent safeguards are in place. In the first place the Anaesthetic Department at the DGH must oversee the activities of the peripheral GP Anaesthetists, which in practice means that in many Community Hospitals the consultants play a much more active part, but this is not universally so.

With more surgery being carried out as day cases new techniques must be learnt, and new equipment mastered - the Laryngeal Mask Airway and regional blocks being just two of the procedures which in modern anaesthetic practice are deemed to be essential. Another problem facing the GP Anaesthetist is that the Royal College has recommended a minimum number of anaesthetics which constitute safe practice, a number which is very difficult for a GP to attain given the huge rise in demand in general practice today.

An active operating theatre in a Community Hospital gives vibrancy to the work of the hospital, and it is now acknowledged by many Trusts that for routine surgery this service is a valuable asset. It would be a shame if GP Anaesthetists were to be disqualified from their work by edicts from the Royal College when their record of service has been so valuable.

MINOR INJURIES UNITS/CASUALTY SERVICES

70% community hospitals offer a minor injuries or casualty service. Most are open 24 hours a day, with GP medical cover. There is an increase in the number of nurse-led units, staffed predominantly by Nurse Practitioners.

The units have a role in assessing and treating minor injuries and ailments. The most frequently recorded reasons for presenting are fractures, lacerations, infections and foreign bodies.

The units also have a role in health promotion & accident prevention. Staff are usually familiar with the patients they are treating, and are able to monitor health and accidents within the local resident population.

The service is considered to relieve pressure on Accident and Emergency Departments in acute units and thereby improve waiting times. Certainly it enables the DGH to focus resources on those patients who require more specialist intervention.

MIUs act as a referral point. It may be appropriate for the patient to be referred back to the GP, or onto the A/E Department. Staff can organise referrals to consultant medical staff, clinics or community teams. The fact that an initial assessment can be carried out without delay in a local health facility enables patients to be advised on the most appropriate route for their care. This ease of access to clinical staff provides a level of reassurance to the local population.

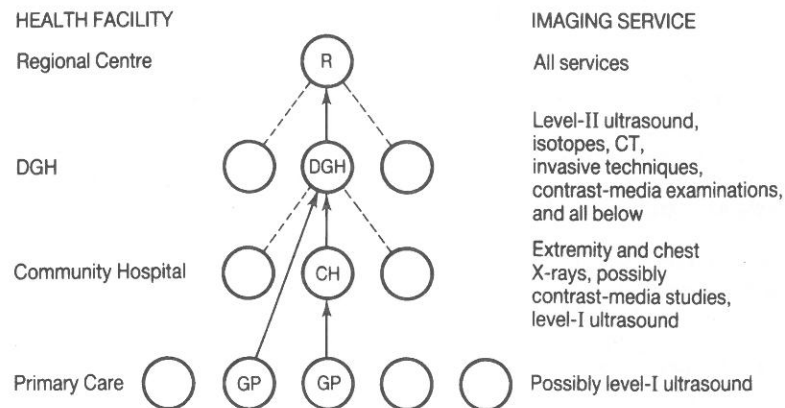
Medical and nursing staff work closely together in MIUs, and agree protocols and procedures to guide the clinical practice. The continuity and consistency of care is ensured by the primary and community links, through GPs, community nursing and community hospital nursing. Specialist nurses and therapists are also part of the local team.

Patient satisfaction surveys in MIUs have demonstrated a high degree of satisfaction with the service. It is the part of the hospital that most patients are familiar with, and is a service that can be accessed by the whole community.

IMAGING SERVICES IN THE COMMUNITY HOSPITAL

An X-ray department with overall responsibility for imaging services generally is now an essential provision in any active Community Hospital. Despite numerous recent finance driven threats to their existence and function the future organisation of imaging services can now be represented diagrammatically:



A model for decentralised and community based imaging services

To support a casualty service the minimum provision is a 9.00am – 5.00pm ability to take extremity and chest films, which are reported either by a combination of radiographer and GP, using a red dot system and/or supported by tele-radiology pacs/digital imaging link with a consultant unit. The approximate cost of equipping a unit for this service is £80,000, and a simple state-of-the-art ultra-sound apparatus adds a further £50,000. If contrast media examinations are to be performed an immediate resuscitation service must also be available.

Ultra-sound has now achieved a hallowed place in maternity care, and since this is a high volume service it should be provided locally if possible. There is debate about the status and training of operators and the implications for counselling facilities when foetal abnormalities are diagnosed. Telemetry may solve this problem and increase the potential use of ultra-sound in diagnosing other pathology at Community Hospital level.

A successful service will depend on regular review, adequate training programmes, and inter-disciplinary meetings, and no community unit should develop without regular consultant contact. This will be much facilitated by improvements in telemedicine.

GENERAL PRACTITIONERS AND MATERNITY CARE

The role of the GP in maternity care is changing: fewer provide intrapartum care, and many provide less antenatal care. Many small units have been closed and others have been or are changing from GP led to midwife led units with ventouse practitioners and resuscitation trained midwives.

These changes have occurred despite many statements supporting a continued role for appropriately trained and committed GPs. The Royal College of General Practitioners (RCGP), Royal College of Midwives (RCM) and General Medical Services Committee (GMSC) have all produced such publications, as has the Association for Community Based Maternity Care (ACBC). This latter organisation continues to provide a supportive forum through newsletters, meetings and publications for midwives, GPs, hospital doctors and patients.

GPs have one of three roles in maternity care. First, they can be supportive of women's choices but not directly involved themselves e.g. appropriate home births. The clinical evidence is clear that home births are no safer or more dangerous than hospital birth for a selective range of women. Second GPs can provide psychosocial support for women antenatally, postnatally and during labour. Third GPs can have the traditional GP obstetrician role where in addition to facilitating choice, and providing psychosocial support they also provide hands on practical care. This will include not just neo-natal resuscitation and perineal suturing but things such as induction of labour, augmentation with somtosinol and operative delivery.

Another exciting development is the institution of the Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO) courses. They are intensive two-day theoretical and practical courses on how to deal with unexpected and sometimes predictable maternal and neo-natal emergencies. The teachers comprise around twelve to fifteen midwives, GPs and Consultants with thirty six to forty eight learners. They end in an exam both practical and theoretical and a certificate of completion is awarded. They have been shown to increase the confidence of those who attend. There are at present twelve to fifteen courses each year around the country.

For those who are involved significantly in maternity care it is strongly recommended that they should join the ACBC and also attend an ALSO course.

MIDWIFERY LED UNITS FROM A MIDWIFE'S PERSPECTIVE

Midwives who are fortunate enough to work in a midwifery led unit within a Community Hospital will probably never want to work anywhere else! Midwives, mothers and their families working together form an excellent team to provide a unique and local midwifery service.

Honiton Maternity Unit in East Devon became a midwifery led unit in the autumn of 1995. One practice of general practitioners (GPs) seven miles away still officially provide GP led care within the maternity unit for mothers registered with them. (11.5% of the unit births).

Since offering midwife led care the number of births in the unit has increased by 68%. With the support of our new guidelines and protocols, the midwives have adjusted well to providing a total service for mothers who choose this option of care.

Midwives have direct telephone access to the obstetric and neonatal registrars or consultants in the consultant obstetric unit 16 miles away and need not refer to a GP to arrange a transfer of care. We meet with the ambulance paramedic supervisors twice a year to discuss policies, procedures, transfers, emergencies and a training issues.

Once a year annual statistics are formally discussed with the consultant obstetrician, neonatologist, GPs, midwives, paramedics and other relevant professions.

The midwives are well supported for attending required study days and two have completed the Advanced Life Support in Obstetrics (ALSO) course. As a Supervisor of Midwives, I am based within the unit and professional issues can therefore be discussed easily. We have regular unit and midwifery meetings in order to maintain good communication and to update our knowledge and skills.

With the freedom of providing maternity led care, we re-arranged most routines previously practised in the unit. For example, instead of the pre-booked weekly antenatal clinics on Thursday afternoons, each mother now telephones the maternity unit to arrange a time convenient for her and her husband/partner.

Every mother receiving antenatal care is given the units telephone number for 24-hour advice and we also act as the contact number for community midwives.

Each year we invite a group of parents to come back and tell us what is good about our service but also what services we can improve. This year for example, we changed our visiting hours as the mothers felt open visiting was too tiring and now although visiting is not restricted for fathers and siblings, visiting hours for other relatives and friends are now between 3 and 8pm.

Community Hospital Maternity Units throughout the United Kingdom provide excellent total care for mothers with the low-risk pregnancies. It has been a recognised for some time that these units are no less safe for mothers considered to be low risk than a consultant unit. Honiton's maternity unit could easily cope with double the number of births, which would assist in relieving some of the pressure on our colleagues in the consultant unit. In turn this would also mean that high risk mothers would receive more quality time from the obstetric teams.

As women become more aware of services available to them, hopefully Honiton and our fellow units will have increased numbers of babies born in them - giving greater all-round satisfaction to mothers and midwives and more cost-effective care for the health service as a whole.

TELEMEDICINE: A BRIGHT FUTURE FOR RURAL HOSPITALS?

Telemedicine has the potential to transform the role of community hospitals. After decades of neglect and the steady drift of services to large District General Hospitals, it is possible that Community Hospitals could become the mainstay of care provision in the future. Modern telecommunications could enable patients to be investigated and treated within their own communities and at the same time ensure that staff and doctors can liaise freely with experts and specialists in large tertiary centres. It is important that the potential beneficiaries of these services are involved in the decision making and in their evolution. Management and ultimately government may consider it appropriate and cost effective to replace a service with a link and a person with a screen. This could have enormous implications for minor casualty units, small obstetric units, radiology services and other local services, which have evolved to meet local need and are in tune with local circumstances.

What are the implications for such a major change in the role of the community hospital in the future. Resources will need to be found to fund the developments. Some of the funding will need to come from Government but it is important that resources should also follow the patient as they begin to drift back to their community hospitals. Community hospital design and development will also need to be modified to incorporate new technology and the potential for extending the traditional range of service. In- and outpatient services will remain important but new emphasis will need to be given to diagnostic and day treatment services. The local health service could clearly be different from anything that we have experienced in the past.

Community hospitals can at last become part of the mainstream of the NHS family. They will be in a unique position to blur the boundaries between primary and secondary care and will become the interface between hospital and community care. The growing number of elderly dependant patients poses one of the major challenges to the care sector over the next ten years. Electronic links into patient's homes will enable elderly chronically ill patients to maintain their independence at home. It makes sense that the electronic hub of these home care networks should be established in community hospitals, where the clinical resources are based. This will result in community hospitals living up to their names and becoming truly virtual community centres. Rather than being seen as purely illness based, the hospitals of the future could become information centres where the public can access databases related to their health and well being.

Improvements will not come on their own however. Many community hospitals remain in the technological dark ages and the information revolution has passed them by. A NHS Information Strategy is not enough. A cultural shift needs to take place. Local communities must identify their needs and potential now. IT needs to be de-mystified, staff have to be trained, communications links need to be established and everybody needs to feel confident in the new world of information. No specific community hospital training packages are available and an IT component to the current accreditation scheme would be a major boost.

It is exciting but difficult to envisage the myriad of opportunities for Community Hospitals in the future. The aims of the founding fathers of many of the original hospitals set up with local subscription was quite clear in that they intended that patients be treated as close as possible to their homes. We have tended to forget these aims over the years as the baggage and politics of health care has taken the focus away from local issues. Local and high quality health care is an essential ingredient of any vibrant community and we should ensure that we use technology to insist that this philosophy prevails.

RESEARCH AND COMMUNITY HOSPITALS

The research base of Community Hospitals is in its infancy and there is a dearth of information regarding organisational, clinical and quality issues. This deficit is important as too often Community Hospitals are threatened with closure on the basis of lack of evidence of their effectiveness, a criterion that is not always so rigorously applied to other parts of the NHS.

The recent editorial by Professor Lewis Ritchie and Kate Robinson (1) usefully summarises some of the key areas that need to be researched and evaluated. Much of the work published in peer reviewed literature has been descriptive in nature, describing the work of individual or small groups of hospitals. Helen Tucker published a monograph in 1987 (2) that helped focus attention on Community Hospitals that had in the main been ignored during the reorganisations of the NHS in the previous 20 years. More recently work has been published demonstrating that Community Hospitals are associated with significant reductions in admissions to District General Hospitals (DGHs), particularly for general medical and geriatric cases. The economic case for Community Hospital care has been convincingly demonstrated with Community Hospital beds costing around one third to one half of DGH beds. Work is in progress evaluating the benefits and disadvantages of outpatient clinics held in Community Hospitals.

The role of cancer palliative care has been extensively researched (discussed in an accompanying article) and clearly shows the substantial contribution made by Community Hospitals.

With the next reorganisation and formation of Primary Care Groups it is vital that research evidence for the continuing and possibly expanding role of Community Hospitals is forthcoming. Randomised controlled trials (RCTs) comparing Community Hospital care with DGH care or hospital at home are difficult, but not impossible to organise and there are opportunities to fund methodologically sound studies within the reorganised NHS research budget. Smaller, qualitative studies will be helpful in answering questions that RCTs cannot address- such as the effect on patients and carers of care delivered locally and by their own general practitioner and issues of communication.

The CHA exists to encourage, report and where possible co-ordinate research into Community Hospitals. The Community Hospitals bibliography (a summary is contained in this directory) is continually updated by the CHA and is available in paper and electronic form. This source of references is a useful basis for starting a literature search. I am also gathering information on research projects and audits in progress and would welcome details from those involved. Updates on research projects will appear from time to time in *Challenge*, the CHA newsletter.

LEAGUE OF FRIENDS AND FUND-RAISING

Over the years the League of Friends has helped with financial contributions to fund parts of the NHS including Trusts, Health Authorities and to, an increasing degree, Community Hospitals. The League of Friends is registered with the Charity Commissioners and has a Constitution, which details the structure and function that they have representing their Community Hospital. The majority of Community Hospitals, but not all, has a League of Friends and their Constitutions and functions, barring some minor variances, will be very similar across the country. There is a National Association of League of Friends and most counties have regional organisations as well.

The League of Friends considers their Community Hospital as a whole. They have provided enormous financial support which has funded equipment, building, redevelopment, new staffing initiatives, new services, transport facilities and many other areas too numerous to list. One of their main functions has been fund raising to finance the initiatives outlined above. Sometimes this fund-raising has been to such a large extent that the League of Friends has co-opted a fund raising committee to facilitate and organise a major fund-raising scheme. This is perfectly acceptable under the Constitution of the League of Friends and it can be a very successful means of achieving income. It is increasingly important, especially in today's political climate, that protection of money raised by the League of Friends is achieved. If the Health Authorities and Trusts do not have the money to invest in capital improvements and the local community raises this money then the local community should have protection of the money. This is possible to achieve legally and a legal undertaking can be drawn up between the League of Friends, the Health Authorities and Trusts. These undertakings do not insure longevity of a hospital but in the event of closure then some money raised can be handed back to the community that initially raised it for health care use.

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CHA CONSTITUTION

1. NAME

Community Hospitals Association formerly known as the Association of General Practitioner Hospitals AGPH (hereinafter called "the Association").

2. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aims and objectives of the Association are:

- (a) To encourage the improvement and extension of the range of services provided by Community Hospitals
- (b) To collate and disseminate information on all aspects of work carried out in Community Hospitals
- (c) To demonstrate the quality and cost effectiveness of patient care provided by Community Hospitals
- (d) To give help and advice to members in furthering the interests of Community Hospitals
- (e) To positively support Community Hospitals through periods of change
- (f) To promote, assist and co-ordinate education and research in Community Hospitals
- (g) To foster and develop strong links between the Association, Member Hospitals and the communities they serve
- (h) To promote audit within Community Hospitals
- (i) To maintain a data base of Community Hospitals and produce a newsletter
- (j) To encourage and facilitate communication between Community Hospitals
- (k) To organise an Annual Symposium of which the main themes shall be to present:
 - (1) Research and audit
 - (2) Co-ordinate education and interdisciplinary management
 - (3) Organise groups on topical subjects

3. MEMBERSHIP

Open to all interested in furthering the aims/objectives of the Association

Categories:

- (1) Hospital membership
- (2) Individual membership
- (3) Corporate membership including:
 - * Trusts
 - * League of Friends
 - * Scottish Association
 - * Companies manufacturing equipment for Community Hospitals
- (4) Honorary membership

Voting Rights:

- (1) Paid up hospitals have a single vote. Hospitals should delegate a person to cast their vote at the Annual General Meeting.
- (2) Individual members single vote
- (3) Corporate membership no vote
- (4) Honorary membership no vote

4. PRESIDENT/VICE PRESIDENT & PATRONS

A President, Vice President and Patrons may be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Association.

The President and Vice President's term of office is five years and are eligible for re-election. Patrons can be for life.

5. OFFICERS

The following Officers shall be elected from among its members:

- Chairman
- Vice Chairman
- Secretary
- Treasurer

Additional Officers may be appointed if desired. All Officers shall hold office for three years and shall be eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

6. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

An Executive Committee will be appointed at the Annual General Meeting to consist of:

- (1) Officers: Chairman
 - Vice Chairman
 - Secretary
 - Treasurer
- (2) Additional Members:

A maximum of 10 to hold office for three years and eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting
- (3) President/Vice President/Patron:

Not members of the Executive Committee automatically but could be co-opted on to committee as individual or hospital members.

7. ADMINISTRATION

- (A) The administration of the Association shall be vested in:
 - (i) General Meetings
 - (ii) Executive Meetings
- (B) The working year of the Association shall end on 31st December.

8. GENERAL MEETINGS

- (A) An Annual General Meeting within 6 months of the termination of the Association's working year, and the business to be transacted shall include:
 - (i) Adoption of Annual Report
 - (ii) Election of Officers
 - (iii) Election of Executive Committee
 - (iv) Approval of audited accounts
- (B) The Annual General Meeting may consider such other business as they determine provided such business shall have been previously notified on the agenda at least 48 hours before the Annual General Meeting.
- (C) The Chairman of the Association may at any time call a Special General Meeting. The Secretary shall then call such a meeting within 21 days. Additionally the Secretary shall call a meeting if a written request to do so is received and signed by no fewer than 50% of the members of the Executive Committee. General Meetings shall be required to effect any change in the Constitution of the Association, and shall require 75% of those present.
- (D) The Annual General Meeting shall be open to members of the public who may attend but not vote. All members of the Association will be given at least one month's notice of the time, date and place of the Annual General Meeting.

9. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETINGS

- (A) Executive Committee Meetings shall be held at least three times per year.
- (B) Attendance will be recorded and published expenses incurred by committee members when attending to Association business will be reimbursed.
- (C) The general business of the Association shall be conducted by an Executive Committee which shall consist of Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and additional 10 members elected at the Annual General Meeting. In the event of resignation or retirement of committee members the vacancies will remain until replacement at a General Meeting. The Executive Committee have the power to co-opt members.
- (D) The Executive Committee shall have the power to appoint a solicitor and an Auditor and such Officers as they in their opinion are necessary for the conduct of the business of the Association and to decide which duties should be allocated and what salaries or remuneration should be paid to such Officers.
- (E) The Executive Committee shall have the authority to exercise all powers and functions other than such as are exclusively conferred upon the Annual General Meeting or Special Meeting of the Association.
- (F) The Executive Committee shall have control of the funds of the Association and shall authorise payment of accounts for which the Association is liable. Any profit from money received from education activities must be used for the continuance and improvement of the educational service and not to be distributed.
- (G) One third of the members of the Executive Committee shall form a quorum.
- (H) The Chairman or the Vice Chairman shall preside at the meeting of the Executive Committee except that where both are absent those present shall elect from their number a person to take the chair at the meeting during such absence. The Chairman shall have a casting vote.

10. FINANCES

- (A) All monies received on behalf of the Association shall be paid into their account with the Association's Bankers and the accounts shall be operated with the signature of two of the following:
 - Chairman
 - Vice Chairman
 - Treasurer
 - SecretaryThis applies to amounts exceeding £2,000 for sums less than this the Treasurer's signature alone is sufficient.
- (B) The Association's financial year shall end on the last day of December.
- (C) The Auditors shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting to audit the accounts for the current year.
- (D) The Executive Committee shall insure major events e.g. The Annual Conference to cover liability of committee members.

11. TERMINATION OF THE ASSOCIATION

- (A) The Association may not be wound up without a resolution to do so at an Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting for which at least 3 months' notice must be given.
- (B) The assets of the Association shall be disposed of by the Executive Committee after discussion with the Association's Auditor and Solicitor.

12. ALTERATIONS TO CONSTITUTION

Change to the Constitution requires the assent of at least three quarters of those present and entitled to vote at an Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting of the Association, due notice of the meeting and resolutions having been given.
