### SUPPORTING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT IN COMMUNITY HOSPITALS & COMMUNITY SERVICES

The 2026 programme includes 19 workshops and plenary sessions covering:

- ◆ Delirium and dementia care
- ◆ ReSPECT planning
- ◆ Workforce development and professional nurse advocacy
- ◆ Research, innovation and quality improvement in community settings

- ◆ Gain practical examples of service redesign and pathway development
- ◆ Understand how national audit data informs local improvement
- ◆ Share learning with peers delivering similar services
- ◆ Identify approaches to strengthen workforce sustainability
- ◆ Return with ideas that can support local service improvement
