The relationship between a community and its health care providers is complex and dynamic



In 2017 New Devon CCG claimed that

"a closure of inpatient beds will help address their ongoing deficit - one of the largest in the country...."



The people of Honiton were not included in the consultation document – a decision had already been made pre- consultation that our local medical beds would close

What did the Community do next?



WE MARCHED!

The people wanted to have their say



There were calls for a
Judicial Review and
people started sending
money to The Friends at
the Hospital

Within 1 week £25,000 was received

We found a human rights solicitor willing to act for us We found a barrister We suddenly had a QC!



We worked up a case

We thought it was a strong one

We sent a PAP [Pre-Action Protocol] letter We received a reply

Our case did not seem so strong

We learned that the law is about facts not emotions

Through the conflict we started talking











Time to evolve
The Friends wanted to remind
people that the hospital is not just
about the medical beds.







We set up Community Conversations on mental health, loneliness, volunteering and young peoples' health and wellbeing

Our health and wellbeing in Honiton really does **matter** to every single member of this community and we are now **talking** about it, are you listening?



Crowborough War Memorial Hospital

In 1999 the Friends supported the redevelopment of the old 19th Century building with matched funding of £1.5M to help provide a Community Hospital for the 21st Century. The hospital continues to have an enviable reputation for community support and fund raising that helps to provide first-class treatment to both in-patients and out-patients, and contains a midwife-led birth centre that acts as a local maternity care centre for pregnant women.


